About the Course

Background

Protection of human rights of women and girls as well as promotion of their empowerment is an essential prerequisite of the achievement of gender equality. The concept of empowerment means gaining power and control over one's live as well as an access to resources and opportunities. It enables women to be economically active and self-sufficient; to participate in labour and product markets on equal terms; renegotiate and re-shape the gender division of labour within households; accumulate and have access to assets; influence governance and institutional structures that inform the relationship between the market and the state as well as the processes that determine the pace of economic development.

Empowerment can be understood in a variety of different frameworks: (1) individual and collective; (2) economic, social, political, cultural; (3) and in local, national, and global terms. Empowering women to participate fully in economic, social and political life across all sectors is essential to build stronger societies, achieve internationally agreed goals for development and sustainability, and improve the quality of life for women, men, families and communities.

This course is part of a trilateral project between SlovakAid and MASHAV for participants from Moldova, Georgia and Ukraine.

Aim

The main aim of this training program include the promotion of gender equality and sustainable development by examining the concept of empowerment in economic, social and political realm. It will offer a cross-cutting perspective thanks to which the participants will explore and reflect on obstacles to gender equality and challenges that women and girls have to face in the effort to realize their full potential. Participating lectors will be experts from the Slovak Republic, Israel and other countries of the EU.

Main Subjects

During the course the participants will:

- Explore the concept of empowerment as the key driver for the expanding the ability to make strategic life choices (such as marriage, childbearing, education and employment) in a context where this ability
- was previously denied
- Discuss the role of women and girls in the achievement of sustainable development and the principles of gender mainstreaming
- Reflect on barriers to gender equality
- Discuss concrete measures that create enabling environment for the process of empowerment
- Present a Final assignment a proposal for supporting women to in realizing their full potential

Application

The Course is designed for 25 participants, women and men alike and geared towards policy-makers, professionals, and practitioners working in governmental institutions, agencies and think tanks, NGOs, and women's associations focused on development or related areas.

The course will be held in English.

Participants must arrive on the arrival date, and leave on the departure date. Early arrivals/late departures if required, must be arranged by the participants themselves.

Location and Accommodation

The course will be held at Hotel Bôrik, situated at Bôrik 1628/15, 811 02 Old Town, Bratislava, Slovak Republic. Participants will be accommodated at the same venue in double rooms (two participants per room).

SlovakAid awards a limited number of scholarships. The scholarship covers the cost of the training program including lectures and visits, full board accommodation in double rooms (two participants per

room) and transfers to and from the airport (Vienna – Schwechat). All other expenses are not included in the scholarship and must be covered by participants.
